C It was rare, I was there

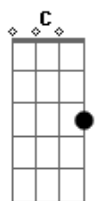

C And I was never good at telling jokes

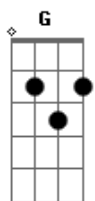

F "I'll get older, but your lovers stay my age"

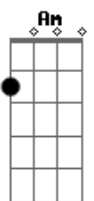

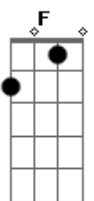
